The Arabic language is very flowery. "Habili" means "unborn," and "Kebir" means "large," so it translates to "The Unborn Great Reef." The term "Habili" always refers to a reef that begins a few meters below the water's surface. In the case of Habili Kebir, the reef top lies approximately 3 to 5 meters below the water's surface.
