Shaab El Erg is a large, horseshoe-shaped reef. At its southeastern end, there is a channel about 8 meters deep between the end of the main reef and two small, round reefs. This channel is beautifully covered with table corals and small coral blocks. With a little luck, you might encounter a school of dolphins while diving at Shaab El Erg.
