Please read the safari information carefully before your trip begins:

Passports and Visas:

All guests must have a passport that is valid for at least six months from the date of arrival. 30-day tourist visas are issued upon arrival at the immigration counter of any international airport in Indonesia for all nationalities and cost 500,000 IDR or the equivalent in USD or EUR.

Alternatively, you can apply for a tourist visa online by creating an account and paying in advance through the official government website at molina.imigrasi.go.id.

All visitors must be in possession of a return or onward ticket. Complete the electronic customs form at ecd.beacukai.go.id 24 hours before arrival, take a photo of the QR code, and present it upon request.

Upon arrival:

Please allow sufficient time between your international flight arrival in Bali or Jakarta and your domestic flight to Labuan Bajo to account for possible delays. Upon your arrival on the day the safari begins, an EcoPro Divers staff member will meet you at the time of your flight's arrival outside the exit of the arrivals area, past baggage claim, at Komodo Airport in Labuan Bajo—easily recognizable by a sign reading "EcoPro Divers" or "EcoPro Duyung Baru." Our staff member will then escort you to the boat, where you can check in.

For guests already staying at a hotel in Labuan Bajo, the meeting point is at 11 a.m. at the KP3 Jetty.

Please allow us time to coordinate all arrivals as efficiently as possible, and expect a short wait if necessary.

IMPORTANT: The latest check-in time is 12:00 p.m.

Insurance:

We require all divers to have valid insurance that covers diving accidents. Proof of coverage must be presented to the dive guides at check-in.

We assume no liability and will not cover costs such as those for the hyperbaric chamber and transportation. The nearest hyperbaric chamber is located in Labuan Bajo at Siloam Hospital.

Diving:

There are no dives on the arrival or departure days, and on the days spent in the marine park, we do 3 dives. On the morning of the day before departure, there are one or two dives. In the afternoon of that day, the boat returns to the harbor. Divers must ensure that at least 24 hours elapse between their last dive and their flight (or ascent to higher altitudes).

For all dive sites visited along the way, our dive guides will provide you with a detailed and comprehensive briefing before you enter the water. All dives are guided; diving without a guide in buddy teams is not permitted anywhere in Komodo National Park. Within the dive groups led by a dive guide, each diver is assigned a buddy. As certified divers, our guests are responsible for their own safety and that of their buddy during the dive. They must also follow the dive plan and procedures and remain with the group at all times. Each diver must have their own dive computer. Dives must be started, conducted, and ended with the group. You are expected to be capable of diving in accordance with the certification and experience requirements specified for each itinerary and thus be able to complete the dive with your buddy and under the guidance of the dive guide.

Your maximum dive depth depends on your certification and the experience of both dive partners. It is your responsibility to verify the depths covered by your insurance before arrival. Decompression diving, solo diving, and technical diving are strictly prohibited.

Courses:

We offer a range of courses on board, from advanced courses to a variety of specialty courses. Courses are subject to availability and the itinerary and include course materials (if required) and the certification fee. A 10% service fee will be added for onboard bookings.

Courses must be requested before the trip begins.

Diving Equipment:

We recommend the following diving equipment:

mask, snorkel, fins, boots, wetsuit, regulator, reef hook, BCD, SMB (with at least 5 meters of line for deployment during the safety stop), and a dive computer with spare batteries and a flashlight for night dives.

The average water temperature is 27 °C, but cold currents may occur, so we recommend a 5-mm wetsuit.

A limited amount of rental equipment is available. Rental equipment must be requested prior to the trip. We need information on your wetsuit size, weight, height, and shoe size so we can prepare the right equipment for you.

For safety reasons, all divers must carry a dive computer, an SMB, and reef hooks for every dive, as well as a flashlight for night dives throughout the entire safari. Please bring your own gear or ask us what's available on board.

Tanks & Adapters:

We have 12-liter DIN tanks and INT adapters available on board. 15-liter tanks can be rented for a fee and only upon request.

Nitrox:

We offer Nitrox, subject to demand and availability. There is an additional charge. Nitrox cannot be guaranteed and is non-refundable in the event of unavailability due to technical issues.

Internet:

At any airport in Indonesia, you can purchase a local SIM card for data/internet, calls, or text messages in the arrivals area upon presentation of your passport. This is inexpensive and provides very good reception in most parts of Komodo National Park, especially in the central area (some locations in the north and south of the park have no reception). Signal strength may vary depending on location and weather conditions, which can lead to temporary interruptions and/or slow connections.

Cabins:

All cabins accommodate two guests. On the lower deck, there are two cabins with double beds and one cabin with two single beds. On the main deck is the SeaView cabin, which features either a double bed or twin beds.

Cabins are sold and assigned prior to arrival. All cabins are air-conditioned and have their own shower and toilet. You do not need to bring your own towels, as shower and beach towels are provided.

Bathrooms:

All bathrooms are equipped with a shower, a sink, and a toilet. Please be especially careful in the bathroom to avoid slipping, and close the shower curtain and door when using the shower.

Please do not flush toilet paper down the toilets on board, as this can cause clogs in the system and potentially damage the sensitive reef ecosystems. Wastebaskets are provided in all bathrooms and are

emptied regularly and disposed of properly.?

We provide eco-friendly shampoo and shower gel, as well as complimentary towels, so our guests do not need to bring their own.

Food and Drink:

Meals on board are typically served as a buffet with a selection of dishes offering something for every taste.

Water, tea, and coffee are complimentary. Soft drinks, fresh juices, and alcoholic beverages (cocktails, spirits, wine, and beer) are available for an additional charge.

If you have special dietary requests, such as vegetarian meals or allergies, please let us know before your arrival.

Alcohol:

Alcohol can be purchased on board. Guests are not permitted to dive after consuming alcohol or while suffering from a hangover, as this seriously impairs your judgment and increases the risk of decompression sickness. If the dive instructors deem you unfit to dive, you will be asked to skip the dive. Your safety and well-being are our top priority, so this request from the dive instructors is made solely to prevent accidents.

Tipping:

Tips for the crew are divided among all service staff at the end of the trip. A tip jar is provided. We recommend at least 15 USD per night.

Currency Accepted Onboard:

All prices on board are listed in U.S. dollars; however, we also accept cash payments in euros, Indonesian rupiah (IDR), and U.S. dollars.

Taxes:

Taxes are included in the prices. A 10% service fee applies to all equipment rentals, special tank requests, and onboard purchases paid for on site.

In addition, Komodo National Park charges a port and national park fee of 36 USD per person per night.

Please ensure you have sufficient cash on hand to cover your expenses.

Electricity:

Standard 230 V, European outlets (Types C and F)

We assume no liability for damage caused by alternating current.

And finally:

If you've never been on a liveaboard before, you should be prepared to make some adjustments to your normal routine in order to enjoy your week. Please remember that you are in a foreign country with a different culture.

If you encounter any problems during the week, please contact the dive guides as soon as possible. The guides and the boat manager will always do their best to resolve them. Even with the best intentions in the world, unspoken difficulties cannot be resolved—so please bring any concerns to our attention. If something remains unresolved, please discuss it with the boat manager at the end of your week.

Check-out:

Check-out time on the day of departure is no later than 11:00 a.m. Your cabins must be vacated by this time.

Direct transfers from the boat to the airport, hotel, restaurant, or spa are arranged as group transfers; however, a private transfer option is available for a fee of 15 USD per person.

Important Information!!!

Due to DAN's revised insurance policies, it is essential to inform all divers aged 75 and older that they must provide a medical certificate from a doctor specializing in diving. The certificate should confirm your fitness to dive—your current state of health. The medical certificate must be emailed to EcoPro Divers so that we can clarify your diving activities with DAN and ensure that our customers' insurance requirements are met in advance.

Please don't forget to specify the boat and the travel date! ?

No diving activities are permitted until DAN has cleared the individual for diving.?

Packing List:

- Personal clothing and toiletries
- For light sleepers, we recommend bringing earplugs
- Waterproof bags to protect electronic devices (e.g., camera, passports) from water damage

during the trip

- Note: Hard-shell suitcases are difficult to stow on board; please use a foldable bag if possible
- Dive log with your most recent dives
- Proof of a valid diving certification
- Valid travel insurance
- Each person must carry a copy of their dive insurance, which may need to be translated into English and must include the policy's start and end dates as well as specific dive insurance coverage. If you cannot provide these documents, you must purchase local dive insurance before participating in diving activities
- Essential medical first-aid supplies and prescription medications

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
